The Settlement and Socio-economic Integration Trajectories of Post-1991 Immigrants to Canada: A View from the Longitudinal Immigrant Database

Lisa Kaida, Professor of Sociology, McMaster University, and Victor Satzewich, Professor of Sociology, McMaster University

This paper provides a demographic profile of post-1991 immigrants from Ukraine to Canada. In addition, it assesses the economic performance of Ukrainian immigrants by focusing on their occupational and earnings trajectories. We compare the earnings and occupations of immigrants from Ukraine with immigrants from Poland, Romania, other former Soviet countries, the rest of the world. We also provide an analysis of the various demographic and human capital factors that account for earnings differences between immigrant groups. Data for this paper is derived from the Longitudinal Immigrant Data Base, a data set that matches immigrant landing records with subsequent Revenue Canada tax records.
